New Research May Hold the Key to Understanding and Treating Hair Loss in Adolescents

About the Adolescent Severe Alopecia Areata Study

This study is designed to evaluate an investigational medicine, taken orally twice a day, to see if it is a safe and effective option for regrowing hair in adolescents living with severe alopecia areata.

Parents may be interested in learning more about this study if their child:

- Is 12 to <18 years of age
- Weighs at least 81 lbs (37 kg)
- Has severe alopecia areata, with the current episode lasting at least 6 months
- Has experienced at least 50% scalp hair loss
- Meets additional study criteria

A parent or legal guardian must provide consent before this study can consider eligibility or discuss further details with a potential participant.

This Study will Take Place in Four Parts

- Screening (up to 4 weeks)
- Study Treatment (up to 24 weeks)
- Open-Label Extension (up to 52 weeks)
- Follow-up (4 weeks after the last scheduled visit)

Reimbursement for reasonable, out-of-pocket expenses for travel and accommodations may be available to qualified individuals.
